



Transportation Guide

MAP | We have prepared a map for you with all the necessary information regarding Event Center locations, embargoed areas, forbidden roads, parking, public transport stops, and suggested access paths to Event Centers and/or stage starting points. The map is available at the link.

CAR | You can reach each Event Center by car. Available parking lots are marked on the map linked above.

Both parking lots near GEOsfera (Tempo and Night PreO EC) are paid; the parking fee is 10 PLN per day. If you plan to use it for both events, you only need to pay once—just remember to keep the parking ticket. Payment can be made by card at the parking machine. Parking is free for those with disabilities displaying a valid badge in the car.

Other parking areas (PreO Sprint EC and PreO EC) are free for all participants.

Be careful not to use forbidden road or cross embargoed areas, as Google Maps navigation may suggest such routes, especially when traveling to Tempo EC.

TRAIN | The competition area is located on the northern outskirts of the city, near Jaworzno Szczakowa train station, making it a convenient option especially for those coming from Katowice and Kraków, with frequent trains running in both directions. It is possible to walk to the Event Centers from the train station, with the following distances:

- PreO Sprint EC: 1.6 km
- Tempo prestart: 3 km
- Night PreO EC: 3,5 km
- PreO EC: 2.7 km

Be careful not to use forbidden road or cross embargoed areas, as Google Maps navigation may suggest such routes, especially when traveling to Tempo EC.





You can also take a bus from the train station to each Event Center-see below.

All rail connections can be found on the <u>website</u>. Note that train connections in Poland are operated by several companies, so ensure you purchase the correct ticket. Tickets are available in multiple ways:

- You can buy tickets directly on the linked website, where the "buy ticket" button will direct you to the correct operator's site.
- At ticket offices at railway stations—knowing the operator of your connection (e.g., Koleje Śląskie, PKP Intercity, Polregio) is helpful, as separate ticket offices sometimes handle different operators.
- On the train—in some trains, there are ticket machines; if not, you can purchase a ticket from the train crew. Be sure to contact the conductor immediately after boarding to avoid a fine. Also keep in mind that tickets bought from the conductor may cost more than at the station or online.

IMPORTANT! Due to ongoing construction of several railway viaducts in Katowice, there may be train delays and changes in departure platforms. Please keep this in mind when planning your journey, and verify platform information at the station.

BUS | There are bus stops next to the Event Centers:

- Szczakowa Cmentarz (PreO Sprint EC)
- Góra Piasku Kaliska (Tempo prestart)
- Geosfera (Night PreO EC)
- Pieczyska Szkoła (PreO EC)

These stops are served by a few bus lines: **304** (from the city center and Jaworzno Szczakowa train station to all three Event Centers and Tempo prestart), **314**, and **344** (from the city center and train station to PreO Sprint EC and PreO EC), **307** and **322** (from the city center and train station to Tempo prestart).

You can also use Jaworzno's public transport to reach the city from Katowice, Mysłowice, Sosnowiec, and Chrzanów on lines A, E, J, and S.





Buses in Jaworzno are operated by PKM Jaworzno. More information is available on their <u>website</u>, which is unfortunately only in Polish, but you can use your internet browser to translate it.

When checking the timetable, remember that bus service is limited on Saturdays and Sundays, and November 11th is a national holiday in Poland, so on that Monday, buses will run according to the Sunday/holiday schedule.

You can purchase bus tickets in several ways:

- Ticket machines in some buses (by card or cash—coins only)
- Open Payment System terminals in all buses, allowing you to pay directly by card
- From the bus driver (by card or cash)

IMPORTANT! If you are traveling by bus from surrounding cities, be aware that a separate public transport operator, ZTM, operates there, with different timetables and tickets. You can check all ZTM stops and lines, as well as timetables and ticket information, on their <u>website</u>.

PLAN YOUR JOURNEY | To plan your journey by public transport, we recommend using <u>Google Maps</u>, as it is the only tool that allows you to search across all the different transportation options and operators. However, to ensure accuracy, it's best to verify timetables on the operator's websites. Google Maps will indicate the operator for each leg of the journey.
